New Refuse Hauler Will Service Lanark

It has been no secret that the Solid Waste Management Board (SWMB) has been working to find a new provider of curbside collection services for waste and recycling. The SWMB began this work in September 2008 when they became aware of the financial difficulties facing contract provider Wittenberg Disposal.

At first the search was for a "contingency" provider that would step in within a few days notice should Wittenberg's money woes serve to interrupt or cease curbside services. Even though Wittenberg Disposal continued to provide service throughout their difficulties, the SWMB felt that several key issues still had the potential to threaten consistent, reliable curbside service to Portage County residents.

Of greatest concern to the SWMB was the condition of the trucks used to service the Portage County contract. Most of the trucks used in Portage County showed significant signs of age and damage. Given that the average cost of a new collection truck is around \$200,000 and the repairs to or replacement of major parts (engines, transmissions, hydraulic systems) would be costs Wittenberg Disposal may not be able to easily manage, the SWMB finally opted to seek bids from a new pool of haulers with greater financial stability.

A request for bids was released on March 24, 2009, with sealed bids opened on April 10th. Four companies qualified to bid on the project (had the financial standing and

attending a pre-bid meeting). However, only two companies opted to submit a bid for curbside collection of waste and recycling.

In the end Veolia ES Solid Waste Midwest (Wisconsin Rapids) was the lowest, most qualified bidder and the SWMB awarded the contract to them at an April 13th meeting. Veolia is slated to begin collection service to Portage County during the week of May 18th.

In the Town of Lanark, Wittenberg Disposal will collect for the last time on May 15th. Carts owned by Wittenberg Disposal will be collected on or shortly after that date. New carts from Veolia will be delivered as they arrive. However, the order for new carts may not arrive by the start date. So, the Solid Waste Department asks that residents of Lanark watch for updates on the department's (http://www.co.portage.wi.us/mrfb/index.htm) and the town's (http://www.townoflanark.org) websites, as well as for announcements in local newspapers.

During the transition period between haulers, the Town of Lanark asks for your patience while route drivers learn new routes and carts are placed as soon as possible. If you do not have a cart before a scheduled pickup day, please put your garbage by the road either in a container you already have or just bagged.

Federal Broadband Grants

Being able to connect to the internet at a high speed is a key benefit that many places in rural Wisconsin are lacking due to inadequate infrastructure to provide high speed connections. Federal funds are available in Wisconsin to improve the access in rural areas of the state. However, part of the problem that exists is knowing where gaps in the current infrastructure limits high speed connectivity. Here is information from the PSC website seeking information on a survey to assist the PSC in awarding federal funds to improve broadband access. The survey can be filled out on-line, but of course if you don't have any connection you will need to contact Gary Evensen at the Public Service Commission (PSC) at (608) 266-6744. If you only have on-line dial up connection without "DSL" service you should advise the PSC in this survey. The hope is that the PSC can award funds to areas of the state that will expand the higher speed connections to more rural people.

Here is the information from the PSC website:

The purpose of the PSCW's Broadband Customer Survey is part of a larger effort to deploy broadband in Wisconsin and ultimately throughout the entire nation. The federal American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) provides for grants to map and deploy broadband, especially to unserved and underserved areas. By completing this survey, you can help identify where the need for broadband exists, and in so doing, help yourself get adequate broadband sooner. If you need to respond for more than one residence or business location, or have more than one type of broadband service at a single location, please repeat the survey.
